Course Description:

In this training, participants learn about the connection between earlier experiences of violence and abuse and current or recent suicidal behavior and/or self injury. The training emphasizes skills building on asking about suicide, addressing unsafe behaviors, promoting connection, and providing resources. Techniques practiced include grounding, safe coping, and responding empathetically to disclosures of suicidal thoughts. Laws and legal parameters are also discussed
