# LGBTQ Training Series: Transgender Foundations June 27<sup>th</sup> and June 28th, 2023 8:30am – 12:00pm

**Course Description:** This workshop introduces transgender concepts across social, cultural, legal, and political contexts. **Instructor Information:** Dylan Colt is a Senior Peer Support Specialist and the Communications Specialist for Consumer Affairs. He has been an activist in the LGBTQ+ community since the mid-1980s. He is currently working with several community groups as well as RUHS to bring greater understanding about LGB, and specifically transgender and Gender Non-Binary issues. Dylan has served on panel presentations for PFLAG and for the County prior to joining the county as an employee. He is an active member of the department's LGBTQ+ task force and other committees that meet to discuss LGBTQ+ challenges, barriers and solutions for service.

Ashley Hanson ACSW is the proud Mother of three openly LGBTQIA+ children. Herself and husband Anthony Richmond SPSS were both recently promoted to "Gamma" and "Gampa". Ashley began her career with RUHS-BH/ISF Wraparound in 2014, where she utilized her lived experience of parenting a child with mental health challenges to support families navigating behavioral health. She then became the first TAY Peer Support within that same program to support youth involved with the Juvenile Justice system. In 2017, she promoted to a Senior TAY Peer Support Specialist with the Resilient Brave Youth Program (RBY) and served commercially sexually exploited children, facilitated community trainings and campaigns to DPSS, RSO, RCAHT, and Stakeholders. In 2019, Ashley graduated from California Baptist University with her Bachelors in Sociology and obtained her Masters of Social Work in 2021. After her completion of school and the WET 20/20 program, she promoted to a Clinical Therapist at San Jacinto New Life Clinic AB109. However, her heart remained true to the evidenced based practice of Peer Support. In 2023, she accepted a promotion for The Consumer Peer Support Programs/education & training Staff Development Officer, and Supervisor for the RUHS-BH Peer Support & Resource Centers. Ashley holds a firm belief that, "Recovery is possible & education is key!"
